Guidelines for preparation of a Commentary

The International Diabetes Monitor focuses on trends in clinical diabetes. Its purpose is to help the diabetes health care team keep abreast of advances in diabetes.

Your Commentary should contain at least 700-800 words and be divided into a short Summary of the original article and a longer Comment as to its relevance:

- Please add a short title of up to 6 words
- Please provide 6 key words
- The Summary should focus on the clinical aspects of the article
- The Comment is the most important part. It should stress the relevance and importance of the article to clinical diabetes practice and avoid a discussion of scientific intricacies, unless these are relevant to the conclusions drawn. It should mention problems and put them into perspective for the reader. A reiteration of the material contained in the Summary is not appropriate for the Comment
- If reference is made to other published articles, a reference list should be supplied after the Comment. Please do not submit references as endnotes.
- Please select a suitable figure(s) or table(s) from the original article if appropriate, or you may supply one of your own. If you select a table from the original article, and do not wish to add or delete anything, it is not necessary to retype it with your manuscript
- If applicable, please provide a box (or boxes) highlighting the implications for clinical practice raised by your Commentary
- Highlight any short phrases in the text (preferably in full capitals, approx. 1-2 lines) that are especially important. These will be set as highlighted 'call outs' in the final proof
- At the end of your Commentary please include your bank details so that payment (EUR 250) can be made promptly upon publication.
